Dear Parents and Caregivers, Tena ra koutou katoa

> "Ma te huruhuru ka rere te manu Adorn the bird with feathers and it will fly"

Following Instructions: (cont' on from last newsletter) The building blocks to develop following instructions include: Hearing; Understanding language (comprehension of language, especially concepts and vocabulary); Attention and concentration (sustained effort, doing activities without distraction and being able to hold that effort long enough to get the task done); Working memory (the ability to temporarily retain and manipulate information involved in language comprehension, reasoning, and learning new information and to update this information as change occurs). Generally, by the time children are 4 years of age they can follow 3 part instructions (e.g. point to the cat, the dog and the monkey"). We can help children to improve following instructions through:

<u>Eve contact (get visual attention before giving the</u> instruction); <u>Single instructions (just one at a time</u> until they have mastery); <u>Simple language</u> (simple and direct); <u>Break it into parts (follows with the</u> single instruction. If there is more than one action in the instruction, give one and when that has been completed give the next); <u>Repeat (get your child to</u> repeat the instruction back to you); <u>Clarify</u> (encourage your child to ask for clarification if they forget part of the instruction or are not sure what to do.); <u>Visual aids</u> (e.g. pictures, gestures body language, facial expression can be used to assist); <u>Visual cues (can often be very useful to help the</u> child follow longer instructions).
