At the end of last term, I did ask for Spring!!! And it looks like it has come, sunshine, rain, warmth and cold - all on the same day.

Country Fair: Saturday 2nd November 10am - 2pm.

This event is a Whangarei community day and we have great participation from all sectors of Whangarei. It is also the major fundraiser for the school with funds raised going toward developing outdoor areas and learning environments. The recent turf development was made possible through the efforts of the Country Fair.

BUT.... the day doesn't just happen. There is an energetic group of parents who are working away behind the scenes to organise the many facets that make the day a huge success - rides and attractions, white elephant/garage sale; stalls; food; entertainment; parking; signage; etc.

An area that is proving difficult is getting enough helpers on the day. We need positive, enthusiastic people to undertake jobs on the day. It is 2 hours of commitment, either 10 - 12pm or 12 - 2pm (short of helpers in the afternoon) This still gives you time to get around the Fair. Without the volunteer support, we will not be able to run the day. With around 300 families in the school, we must be able to get 50 volunteers. A yellow notice was sent home last term for you to fill out if you could help. If you have filled it out and haven't heard from us, please get in touch. Remember that we look on the day as a school day, with parents coming to support their children and the school.

Kapa Haka Roopu: Our fabulous kapahaka roopu now has a name! With the many performances the group is involved in, and the importance of belonging, the group needed a name. After careful consideration, Te Ahorangi te kura o Maunu (The

Enlightenment of the Maori language) has been chosen. The first performance of the newly named Te Ahorangi te kura o Maunu was for the Pink Ribbon Walk on Sunday 20 October. The group performed for the many walkers, with waiata and haka. Again, they were awesome. Congratulations to Matua Shane, Whaea Claudine and Ms Hesketh for preparing the roopu so well. Thanks to all the parents who got the tamariki there ready to perform (probably after a late night watching the ABs) and thank you to the tamariki for their excellence, enthusiasm and all-round skill.
