If your child does best with a certain teaching and learning style, or needs to be separated from another child, then I ask that you talk to your child's teacher who will discuss this with you and bring that information to me. This needs to be done by 22 November. Children will meet their 2020 teacher and classmates on Monday 16 December. Maunu School has a quality teaching team. Your support and positive response to class placements will help overcome any slight nerves a child may have. Here at Maunu we encourage staff and children to get to know each other so they can achieve in any of our happy, motivating and focused environments.
