Whew, what an end to the term 2 break, with wild weather and extensive damage to property and services. I trust that anyone affected has been able to get support and get the recovery process underway.

500 Year Storm: At school we had some flooding on the school field and through Rooms 3 & 4. The classrooms have had to be evacuated and the carpets taken out. A number of the resources (mats, cushions, shelves, books) have been damaged beyond repair. We have to thank the following groups for their amazing support: LM Consulting (the school's Project Managers), the MoE Building & Insurance Assessors, ChemDry Garden City – (yes all the way from Christchurch!) and Floorwise who all came to our aid with a rapid response. The carpets were pulled up and taken away, the rooms dried out and new tiles laid, all in 1 week!! The school's contents insurers have also been involved so we can get the process of replacing damaged property underway. With the amount of water that came through the school grounds, we were very lucky not to sustain more damage.

Mrs North's Powhiri: On Tuesday 21 July a group of staff, students and parents attended the powhiri for Molly at Mangakahia Area School. We were there to support Molly, and hand her over to her new school. The kapa haka roopu were superb, again being well supported prior to the event by Whaea Claudine, Ms Hesketh and Matua Shane. Sapphire Reid-Maihi, Carlay-Diaz Toru and Shelby Hoyle carried out the karanga as we entered the hall with power and heart. Logan Hart did the mihi in te reo and was amazing - this was commented on by a kaumatua and the Mangakahia Principal. Lexi Hati led the waiata to support Logan. Charlie Bilner and Ronel Shaji walked Mrs North across the floor to her new colleagues and supported the hand over process. The reason I have given this amount of detail is that it shows how incredible our students are in their cultural inclusion and the te reo and

tikanga programme they are involved in. We wish Mrs North well with her new venture.

Drink Bottles: We are presently looking at replacing the drinking fountains. This involves us looking at the safest and most practical options, but the best possible system is for every child to have their own drink bottle that they bring every day. They can fill these at school. This is the safest option for drinking water for children.

Teacher Only Day: <u>The school will be closed for instruction on Monday 31 August; Week 7</u>. Property Projects: This year the school enters a new 5 Year Property Plan with the MoE. This plan provides a budget, based on the number of students at the school, to enable the school to maintain the buildings and site. This year we also have access to some other funding that was announced last year. This has enabled us to undertake a number of projects that we have had on the plan for some time. The following lists some of the projects we will do over the next few years. LM Consulting will manage the projects on behalf of the school:

- Swimming Pool Seating and Canopy: We will be installing a 4-tiered seating stand with a canopy over the top all the way along the western edge of the pool enclosure.
- Swimming Pool Fencing: The pool fenced area will be extended on the western and northern sides. The fence will be replaced with fencing that secures the area as much as is possible with consideration to height, design and intruder-proofing.
- Pool Changing Rooms: The existing size will stay the same, but each changing room will be enlarged. The storeroom at the western end will be removed to enable this to happen. They will be repainted as well.
- Pool Toilet: This will be upgraded
- Pool Pump Shed: This will be replaced.



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- <u>Lighting:</u> The lights throughout the school (all buildings) will be replaced to meet the quality standards required.
- Room 9, 10 & Library Canopy: A canopy will be erected that runs in front of Rm 9, 10 and the Library to provide shade, increase the indoor/outdoor teaching space and reduce glare.
- <u>Security Cameras:</u> Security cameras will be installed at strategic points around the exterior of the school to provide real time security information.
- <u>Security Alarm System:</u> The internal security system will be replaced with the latest version.
- <u>Flooring</u>: Many internal spaces (classrooms, hall, library, admin) will get new flooring to replace the existing
- <u>Classroom Refurbs:</u> Some classrooms will have work done including replacing sliding doors where necessary.

Roll Growth Classrooms: We are working with the MoE (Auckland) to move the four roll growth classroom project forward. This process has been very frustrating as very little has happened since the announcement at the end of term 1, 2019. We are hopeful that the latest discussions will provide some momentum on the type of rooms, their location on the site and the process for completion.

I am sure you will be aware that there will be some disruption to access, walkways, areas etc during the building phases and we ask that you respect any signage, fencing etc that is required. The old motto of "small term pain for long term gain" is very pertinent during this time.
