Tena koutou, greetings to you all

In this newsletter, I am asking for your help and support. My mantra is to write positive messages in the newsletter, to celebrate our school, students and community. We enjoy being proud of Maunu School and our students. This term, however, there has been a noticeable change in some of our children's behaviour. We have been working hard with everyone around our Values and recognising those who uphold them. We have had external "experts" conduct surveys with the children and they have been amazed at how well our children know the Five Feather Values and can talk about what these mean. That is why it is so disappointing and confusing that quite a number of our children are behaving in ways that are unkind, disrespectful, and "unMaunulike". It is having a major effect on the health of the school, and is not just a few out of sorts children. Behaviours such as name-calling, put-downs, pushing, not including others and damaging property have crept in. We have reviewed, and continue to review, our systems and expectations. We know that many children are trying to live to our values, but even some of our student leaders are crossing the line. We ask that you talk to, and reinforce with your children about the importance of being positive and kind - we know we can get back to being the great and safe place we are all so proud of.

Level 2 is still with us (not for too much longer we hope) so we are still having to work with some restrictions. We are looking at what we can do once we get back to Level 1, to give opportunities for the community to come into the school and celebrate with the students. This will include celebrations from Maori Language Week and other class inquiries. More detail will follow.

Safety: Please use safe practices when dropping off and picking up children from the school. In the afternoon it can be very hectic at the bus bay, the hall car park and along Austin Road. Please do not block the bus bay entrance or exit and do not stay around for a conversation. Do not stop on Austin Road (use the curb parks), do not expect your child to cross the road (you need to come over to the school side to get them), use the roundabout and above all else - Be Patient. Thanks for helping us to ensure the safety of all our children.

Whew - let's finish on a positive note. Spring is here, daffodils are blooming, lambs and calves are frolicking

in the fields and the days are getting longer. Yes, we have seen some unusual behaviours, however, we know that our students are great people (many of them all the time) and we look forward to our Five Feather Values shining through again. I had the pleasure of being a judge for the "Maunu's Got Talent" Round 1. How courageous all the children were to get up there and perform in front of 3 judges!! There was a range of acts from musical items, to dances, to skits. Congratulations and accolades to all who participated. There will be 12 Acts who will go through to Round 2, from which places will be decided. We hope to be able to do this when we are at Level 1, so others can come and enjoy the talents of our performers. Amazing effort everyone.
