Greetings to you all; tena koutou; beannachtaí; abhivaadan; groete

This is the last newsletter of Term 3. It has been a challenging term with the uncertainty around Covid levels and the guidelines around "gatherings" and contact tracing. Now that we are at Level 1, it is hoped that normal business can resume!! As a school, we are still bound to display the QR code and to get back to using the visitor register. For contact tracing purposes, this will mean that whenever you come into the school you will need to use the QR codes placed around the school or sign one of the registers in the classroom or the visitor register in the office.

As I mentioned in the last newsletter, we have experienced some less than desirable behaviours from some of the children over the term. For many of the children these are not usual behaviours. We really hope that the 2 week break and the return to Level 1, will mean that our lovely Maunu children will return to us on 12 October.

End of Term Assembly: This Friday, 25 September we will hold our first school assembly for some time. The assembly will begin at 2pm sharp and will celebrate many of the children's achievements over the term. It will have a focus on the school's Houses, and children are encouraged to wear their Fantail T-shirts. You are most welcome to come along - there will be contact tracing sheets at various doors if you are unable to use the QR codes.

Over the term break, we will be installing new drinking fountains - weather and contractors permitting! These are bright blue and have a filter system installed in them. They have drinking bubblers, bottle filler taps and maintenance taps. These fountains are manufactured by Filters & Fountains and paid for by the PTA. We thank Filters & Fountains for their work and positive interactions and the PTA for their valued support.

SH14: There is some work being carried out along SH14 and Austin Road to do with power poles. Please drive carefully in these areas at all times, but particularly when there are workers around. I have

also had some complaints about people using the median strip between the Museum and Austin Road to "skirt" the traffic queue to turn into Austin Road. This is an illegal move and could be the cause of an accident. I realise that the traffic does build up in the morning, but safety is the first priority.
