# WE ARE A NUT FREE SCHOOL

- Just a reminder to you and to retain your help in maintaining our school as a safe place for all students.
- Several of our students have potentially severe allergies, with some particularly allergic to nuts.
- This is in fact a common problem to varying degrees in the community but, in this case, exposure to nuts in any way could be possibly life threatening.
- In order to address the issue, we ask that you refrain from giving your child any peanuts or products containing peanuts (e.g. peanut butter and some muesli-type bars) in their lunch boxes.



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While some children's particular allergies relate to all nuts, limiting all nuts would be impractical.

 All foodstuffs have their ingredients identified on the packaging and we ask that you consider these carefully. Thank you for your ongoing support.

#### **TURNING ONTO AUSTIN ROAD**

 We have had some complaints about people using the median strip between the Museum and Austin Road to "skirt" the traffic queue to turn into Austin Road. This is an illegal move and could be the cause of an accident. We realise that the traffic does build up in the morning, but safety is the first priority.

#### **ABSENCES**

- If your child is going to be away or late, please either ring the school office as soon as you can 4388060 – follow the prompts to leave a message.
- Or use the Maunu School App (Skoolloop) to notify us of an absence.
- This is a safety issue, helping us to ensure all our children are safe and are where they should be.
- If leaving a message, please record your child's full name, room number and reason they will be absent or late.

#### **LATE ARRIVALS**

If your child is late to class please
ensure that they quickly visit the school
office before they go to class to let us
know that they are now at school. By
telling us as soon as possible it stops us from
ringing you, the parents and caregivers,
enquiring about their whereabouts.

#### **EARLY ARRIVALS**

- Please do not send children along to school before 8.15am, as we do not provide supervision for them. Staff often have meetings or are preparing for the day and are all over the school.
- It is reasonable for children to begin arriving at school from 8.20am, when staff are in the school.

#### **WATER BOTTLES**

We encourage the use of water-bottles in class.
 Please stick to water; it is the only liquid we accept for drinking in the classroom.

#### **SUNHATS**

- Please ensure that your child has a Maunu School sunhat to wear at school. These are compulsory during terms 1 and 4.
- They are available for purchase from the school office for \$13.00 each.

#### SCHOOL DONATIONS/OFFICE MAX

- Thank you to those who have paid their school donation via Office Max, www.myschool.co.nz. The donation for the year is \$110 per child with a maximum of \$220 per family.
- If you have yet to pay your school donations this can be done via the school office by eftpos, cash or an online deposit to our school bank account at the ASB 12-3093-0151775-00.
   Family statements will be sent home next week.
- Provision can be made through the school office to pay the donation in installments spread out through the year. If you have difficulty making this donation, arrangements can be made if you wish to speak in confidence with the office staff.
- Note: For children in all classrooms except Rooms 3,4 & 8 there is a Prime Math \$12.00 charge. Thank you to those who have already paid this.

# WEDNESDAY LUNCH AND FRIDAY PTA SAUSAGE SIZZLE ORDERS

- We use Lunchonline <u>www.lunchonline.co.nz</u> where parents and caregivers can order lunches (menu online) for their children on Wednesday, and a PTA sausage sizzle lunch for Friday.
- The <u>Wednesday lunches</u> will be delivered in time for lunch at 1.40pm. Orders must be in by 8.00am Wednesday mornings.
- The <u>Friday PTA sausage sizzle</u> are cooked by our Mr. Lamb (school caretaker) and delivered to the classrooms at lunchtime. **Orders must be in by** 9.00am Friday mornings.

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#### **TUESDAY SUSHI ORDERS**

#### **BYOD/PHONE/SMARTWATCH**

 At Maunu School students have access to shared iPads in Years 1 - 4 and shared Chromebooks in Years 5 & 6.
 We encourage any student who would like to bring their



own personal device to school to support their learning. We are happy to set up their device on the school BYOD wi-fi network and support students with recommended Apps.

Students wishing to BYOD to school were invited to a meeting with Claire Turton, Deputy Principal, on Wednesday 10th February and a BYOD Agreement will come home this evening to be discussed and signed by a parent and the student before the device comes to school.

# Phone & Smartwatch Policy

We understand that an increased number of students are bringing phones or smartwatches to school for communication and safety reasons. We respect the wishes of parents choosing this option and have a procedure in place to ensure phones and smartwatches are not a distraction to your child's learning or cyber safety concern. Before a child brings a phone or smartwatch to school they must return a signed Smartphone / Smartwatch Agreement to the Office.

 The school does not permit mobile phones or smartwatches to be used on our grounds from 8:00am - 3:30pm. (This includes school trips or camps).

We do acknowledge that some students wear smartwatches. The school currently permits these to be worn for the functionality of telling the time, however, accessing digital content remains prohibited during school hours and if a child is deemed to break this agreement they may lose the privilege of bringing their Smartwatch to school, and the school's behaviour management plan may be invoked.

- If your child does bring a phone to school, it should be placed in the lockable space in the classroom during the school day. At the end of the day, the phone can be accessed to check for messages or calls. If a child needs to return a message or a call it can be done so inside the classroom at the end of the day and then the phone should be placed safely into their bag. If such items are brought to school they are brought at your child's own risk and insured through your own home and contents policy.
- The Office is happy to take a message and send it to your child's classroom with the daily messenger if you need to let them know of a change of circumstances.

#### **PLAYBALL AT MAUNU SCHOOL**

Playball is an International sport and movement programme for 2-8 year olds, which covers a wide range of sports and skills with a low child to coach ratio of 1:8.

Playball will be running after-school lessons at Maunu Primary School for children starting on Monday the 15th February, 3:10-3:50pm. The coaches will be at school when the bell goes to collect the children and take them to the turf. The cost for term 1 (8 weeks) is \$85 per child.
