Staff only Day: The staff enjoyed a very productive day on Friday 4 June at Whangarei Primary. All staff attended and joined with the staff from Otaika Valley and Whangarei Primary Schools. This was a Kahui Ako (Community of Learning) initiative with professional development around Literacy and Cultural games and activities. Maunu staff presented workshops as part of the Literacy sessions and Phoenix Ruka, Sport Northland, took the cultural aspect of the day. We thank you for your support with this.

Building Projects: You will have noticed that the work on the two classroom blocks is progressing. The classrooms will be delivered in modules during the night from Monday 14 to Friday 17 June, all

going well. To enable Rm 15 & 16 to come in, the bus shelter has been demolished and will be re-built. Some trees have to be trimmed and some removed for access in preparation for the pool seating and canopy project which is a major redevelopment of the pool area. All very exciting, but does require some site work. There will be some traffic in and out of the school during that week. Part of the project is also to upgrade the wastewater system and the line from the school to the pump. This means some disruption to the field while it is being dug up and re-laid.
