Maunu School has been a bustling, thriving place in the first half of 2021. The new classrooms are nearing completion, the shade and pool upgrades will get underway in the second half of this year. The board thanks Mr Shepherd for his dedicated oversight of the property projects, in addition to his day job!

Growth is always bittersweet. As we embrace the opportunities it brings, we are mindful of preserving what we love about Maunu School: its space to roam, and its sense of community. To this end, we are grateful for the advocacy of Mr Shepherd and the expertise of board member Rachel Wright, which achieved placement of the new classrooms that minimises impact on greenspace, while creating two new courtyards which integrate the new and existing classrooms.

Less tangible plans now bearing fruit include a professional development focus on improving students' writing skills, and the Positive Behaviour 4 Learning Initiative. The Kapa Haka group has grown so much it needs new clothes! The Kahui Ako, a collaboration between local schools currently focussed on writing, inter-school transitions,

culturally responsive learning and wellbeing, is coming into its own. The board is grateful to Mr Shepherd who has taken on its joint leadership, and to Claire Turton for relieving him to do so.

The board thanks Taryn Marris for her long and tireless contribution to the PTA and the Country Fair, and understands that the covid vaccination programme needs her even more than we do. We are very grateful to Cara Dawson and Nigel Gilmour, who have taken on the Country Fair coordinator role, and to the school community for once again stepping up to make the Fair, and all the added resources it provides for our school, possible.

It is great to see our new staff merge into the life of the school, bringing with them their unique mix of skills, dedication and magic. One of the best things about being on the board is getting to see how much energy, skill - and most of all - caring, the teaching, support and management staff pour into making Maunu the best place it can be, for every child. If you'd like to get a glimpse too, remember that board meetings (3rd Wednesday of the month, 6:30 in the staffroom) are open to the public, and that board elections are in 2022.
