**Greetings to you all**; tena koutou katoa, Saudações a todos vocês, hepinize selamlar, Cyfarchion i chi i gyd

Well here we are in term 4. It has been another disrupted year with Covid Levels causing some times of lockdown and bubble learning at school. It is a reality that Covid appears here to stay in one shape or another. There are many changes that we will hear about for the future of education in NZ, and we will let you know what impact these will have on the school.

As far as Level 2 is concerned, the biggest impact is to do with people other than the school bubble (students, staff and approved facilitators). We are limited to the times when parents and community members can come on site. Under the gathering guidelines, as soon as we have parents on site to be part of an event (assembly, production, athletics etc) we must abide by the numbers guideline - and the school bubble of 380 becomes part of that number.

Country Fair: As you will have seen from a community notice sent out, we have had to cancel County Fair as a one day event. This is because of the uncertainty around Covid Alert Levels, the rules around gatherings at Level 2, and the amount of organisation that goes into the day. We would like to acknowledge all of our wonderful sponsors who have stood by us this year. We thank them hugely for their support and commitment to the Country Fair and the school. The Organising committee are looking at holding a few events as part of a "Country Fair Festival". There will be more information coming out very soon with specific details. We would like to take the opportunity to thank all those who offered support on the day and who have been working in the background to get this day up and running. This is not how we want to do things, but we also know we have an obligation to do our part in the containment of Covid 19.

The school will be holding a **Staff Only Day** on Monday 22nd November. This day will involve staff in review of 2021 and planning for 2022. Please mark this down as **school will be closed for children** on this day. Educare will open provided there are enough bookings so please **book in early on 021946019.**

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
#### HELLO NEW STUDENTS
