This quote is certainly true of the life we are living at the moment. Throughout history, of course, there have been many times of great change and uncertainty. It is comforting to know that in most cases, once everything has settled, people have worked out how to cope with the new norm and developed new ways of being. Decisions around the Covid-19 'rules' will always be contentious and people will have differing opinions. Here at Maunu School, we are bound to adhere to and enact the regulations as they pertain to schools. In some instances, the rules for schools are slightly different to other places. An example of this is the Gathering regulations. Schools can operate with their full school roll (students and staff) but as soon as "visitors" arrive we become a gathering and have to work to these guidelines. This impacts heavily on days such as Athletics days, Friday assemblies and the End of Year Assembly.

End of Year Assembly - Monday 13th December:

Unfortunately, under L2 (and Traffic Light Red) we are unable to have parents and friends come into the school for these events. We have looked at many alternative arrangements, but in the end, there are rules and regulations no matter which way we go that make any alternatives unworkable. The assembly will be held at school and will begin at 10.30am. We will let you know the way to access the live-stream, whanau and family will not be able to join us. The assembly will follow the usual order of events and will recognise the kapa haka roopu (te Ahorangi o te kura Maunu), class awards, School Awards and celebrate and acknowledge the Yr 6 students and families. I am confident that we have explored all the ways we can hold this event, and also know that others will have a different opinion. After looking at the options, we have decided the best course we have is to hold the End of Year

Assembly at school and to "live stream" the event. This is new to us and we are working with Tim Bell (BellTech) to make it happen. Tim has assured us that a link will be available for people to watch the assembly live and for people to watch the assembly at their leisure. We will send this link out as soon as we are able to.

School Pool for Summer: The swimming pool project is well underway and it is scheduled to be completed by 14th December. This includes, new fencing, seating and canopy and the pool painted. The school will not use the pool before the end of the year. It is hoped that we will be able to sell keys to the school community as in the past. However, we have to work around when it will be ready for us to use and the rules in Traffic Light Red. We are working hard to get these resolved asap, but it may take some time. To help us prepare, if you are interested in renting a key for summer at \$120, please let the office know and they will put you on the list. We will then contact you when we are ready to GO - and the key will be given to you on payment of the rental fee and signing the declaration of use form.

End of 2021 and start of 2022: School ends at 2.55pm on Tuesday 14th December. Please note this is a full day. Children will meet their 2022 teacher and classmates on Tuesday 14 December, except for the NE classes who will meet on Wednesday 8 December. Your support and positive response to your child's class placement will help overcome any slight nerves your child may have. Maunu School has a quality teaching team. Here, at Maunu, we encourage staff and children to get to know each other so they can achieve in any of our happy, motivating and focused classroom environments.
