Greetings to you all; tena koutou katoa;

Here we are in April, daylight savings behind us and autumn bringing us cooler nights and clear days. The last day of term 1 is Thursday 14th April. Friday the 15th is Easter Friday and a public holiday. This term has been another challenging one for all, I am sure. As a school, we have had a steady stream of children testing positive with Covid-19 (Omicron) and a greater number having to isolate as a household contact. We have had a few staff test positive and a few more having to isolate as household contacts. There is no doubt this will continue for some time and we need to try and minimise the disruption as much as possible. With the end of the term coming up, please keep us informed if your child either tests positive or becomes a household contact during the break. It is important for our records and because there are some timings around when or if, people have to reisolate. Please email through to office@maunu.school.nz to let us know. Again, I would like to thank you all for your continued support with contacting us and keeping us informed as to your child's status. This has really helped us to keep in touch with children and to keep our records up to date.

Covid-19: As from Tuesday 5th April, there has been no change to the Alert levels. The main change for schools from the latest announcements is that the Vaccine Mandate has been withdrawn. This means that from now on the school may employ people who are not vaccinated. There may be occasions where it is required to be vaccinated when working with a particular child who may be compromised and the school will make this decision at the time of advertising. The withdrawal of the Vaccine Mandate also means that people helping at school (volunteers) no longer need to be vaccinated. This means that if a class is having a trip or needing parent helpers, you will not have to provide any vaccination pass. We ask that you wear a mask when you come into the school grounds to provide another level of safety for students and

staff. If you are volunteering, the teacher will let you know what is required with mask wearing.

Vandalism: Over the past few weeks, the school has experienced some mindless vandalism. This has included all of the outside speakers (for bells and fire alarms) which cost around \$5000 to replace; the netball goals being thrown over the pool fence and into the pool area, and the trampoline mat being ripped beyond repair. This is very frustrating and ends up being quite a cost to the school. This vandalism is mindless, achieves nothing for those doing it and causes disruption for us as a school.

End of Term: Thursday 14th April is the last day of term 1. Hopefully the weather will be a beautiful April, as it has been in the past years. Friday 15th is Easter Friday. Term 2 begins on Monday 2nd May. With some luck we will be in Orange by then!

Life Education: The Life Education caravan, with facilitator Nadine Campbell and her trusted friend Harold has been here this week. All classes will visit the caravan during its time here. This is a great facility and we thank all those businesses who support the Life Ed caravan. Without their support, we would not have this great resource available to us.

ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATIVE SERVICES

This year Maunu School students will not be able to attend the Whangarei ANZAC Day dawn service due to the Covid pandemic. There will be no parade departing Whangarei RSA and



marching to Laurie Hall Park. Instead the service will be a static ceremony at Laurie Hall Park for Veterans, their families and the New Zealand Police.

The grassed area directly below the cenotaph will be reserved for veterans and their families. To protect their health and wellbeing this area will be cordoned off.

Our Mayor will address the service in lieu of a NZDF guest speaker. There will be six wreaths laid during the ceremony. Whangarei RSA (President), Whangarei District (Mayor), Navy, Army, Air Force & Parliament. All other organisations wanting to lay a wreath will be required to wait until the service has concluded.



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As Anzac Day falls on the school Term Break this year and in light of the restrictions around attending, the Maunu School students and teachers will acknowledge our ANZACS early in Term 2 with a special ceremony at school.

The Events Team will sell poppies on behalf of the Whangarei RSA next week, from Monday 11th April. Teachers will share special notices and information each day to acknowledge our ANZACS in the lead up to Anzac Day.

EASTER ENTERTAINMENT DAY

On the last day of Term, we will be having some Easter Entertainment Activities.
