Greetings to you all; tena koutou katoa; groete vir julle almal; niṅṅaḷkkellāvarkkuṁ āśansakaḷ; aap sabhee ko badhaee

Welcome to Term 2. I trust that everyone is well and the incidences of Covid have lessened. We have seen a reduction in the number of positive cases in the school this term. However, we ask that you remain vigilant and let us know if your child tests positive or is a household contact.

Please also note, that as we are not free of covid we will still be contacting families to collect their child if they come across to the office complaining of feeling unwell. We do not know what will happen for those children who had covid 3 months ago, so this term is a bit of a waiting game.

As we are in Orange, there are a number of changes to the way we can operate.

- While it is not compulsory to wear masks at school, we strongly recommend that Yr 5&6 students continue to do so. Our data shows that our senior students generally tested positive with covid after being a household contact, whereas our juniors and middles were often the first in their household. The main difference between the groups was the wearing of masks.
- We ask parents and visitors to wear a mask when they come on site. If you are volunteering, you will be informed as to if or when you will need to wear a mask.
- We will hold full school assemblies (as long as case numbers remain low) and will do the best we can to spread children in the hall.
- have staff who have to isolate for 7 days if they are a household contact or test +ve (or both!!). If this is the case we do everything we can to get another teacher (relieving or from within school) to take the class. This is for at least 5 days, so we often have to have different people. We have avoided mixing classes or having to say that a certain class will need to stay home. We will continue to do our best to keep all classes running, but this does depend on staffing and safety for all.

Attendance: We are very fortunate at Maunu School to have excellent attendance levels. Each term we send data to the Ministry of Education (MoE) and our attendance rates are well above the national, regional and "like-school". The MoE defines regular attendance as 90% or higher. Analysis shows every day has a cumulative impact on a child's learning. Regular attendance also indicates that Maunu families and community consider attending school important.

Absences: Please notify the school through the App, email or phone answer machine if your child is away. Each morning it takes Kristy and Carolyn up to 45 minutes to contact those who are absent at morning "roll-call".

Early to School: We have children arriving at school before 8 o'clock - some as young as 5. This is not a safe practice as teachers are often in meetings and we do not provide supervision at this time. Classrooms are open around 8.15am and teachers are generally around to keep an eye on children. Please respect these times - it is for your children's safety.

School Assembly: Friday 13 May will be a full school assembly beginning at 2.15pm. It is the first inside assembly we will have had for over 6 months. Parents are invited to join us. If you are attending you are expected to wear a mask as it is indoors.

PINK SHIRT DAY



Maunu School is joining the movement on Pink Shirt Day (Friday 20 May), and encouraging our staff and students to Kōrero Mai, Kōrero Atu, Mauri Tū, Mauri Ora – Speak up, Stand Together, Stop Bullying!

Aotearoa has the third-highest rate of school bullying out of 36 OECD countries and one in 10 workers feel discriminated against or bullied at work. Those bullied are far more likely to experience mental health issues.

Pink Shirt Day works to reduce bullying by celebrating diversity in all its forms and supporting schools, workplaces and communities to be safe, supportive, welcoming and inclusive for everyone. To celebrate this important kaupapa we'll be all wearing pink with pride at Maunu School on Friday 20th May. Please do not feel like you have to go out and purchase anything specifically for the day. In the week leading up to Pink Shirt Day we will be discussing ideas and completing activities. On Friday 20th May we will run a special Assembly to discuss the importance of being an Upstander at Maunu School.

'An **Upstander** is defined as a person who uses words and actions that can help someone who is being bullied.'

Pink Shirt Day is a powerful way to spread aroha and kindness and stand up to and against bullying behaviours.


