Thank you to all the people who supported Pink Shirt Day on Friday 20 May. It was a great turnout by the students, who came in all manner of pink clothing! The focus of the day was to highlight how to be an "upstanding" citizen and how there is no need for anyone to be a "bully". Our school Values promote kindness and respect and, for the most part, our children are amazing at following this. \$223 was raised by way of donations, which has been sent on to The Mental Health Foundation.

We have been asked to put the following into our newsletter to enable our school community to make comment:

Safer Speed Limits - Waka Kotahi Consultation. Have your say on safer speeds - 17 May to 14 June.

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency is reviewing speeds at schools and townships on state highways in Northland and north Auckland – to set safer speed limits for everyone. This includes collaborating with iwi and hapū on signage for marae.

We're consulting on new proposed speed limits at schools and townships on 11 corridors of state highway. This includes a proposal for:

- a new permanent speed limit of 60km/h and
- a variable speed limit of 30km/h in the area surrounding Maunu School.

Variable speed limit signs are electronic and legally enforceable. They are used to get traffic to slow down during the peak school periods when students are arriving, and at the end of the day when they are going home.

We want to hear your thoughts on this and any of the other proposed new speed limits on state highways in your area. 

Community Cam.

Communities working together to solve crime. Community Cam™ is a voluntary, not for profit community initiative where people can register a property with CCTV and upload CCTV footage, to help solve crime in their neighbourhood.

How does this work? When a crime is committed, the NZ police can refer to Community Cam™ to quickly identify CCTV locations of registered users in and around the area of the crime. This then allows the Police to contact you to help with an investigation.

Your details are confidential and secure. Only the NZ Police can see your information and, if you choose to upload your CCTV footage, the footage is password protected for your security. Community Cam™ just lets them know who owns a CCTV system to save valuable time door-knocking.

Do you have CCTV on your property and would like to help your community? Register your details with Community Cam™ and NZ Police will be in touch if they need your help to solve a crime in your area.
