This week is **Support Staff** Week where we recognise and celebrate those in our school who support the children and teachers. These are our Learning Support Assistants (Teacher Aides); Office staff; Librarian and Caretaker. Like all schools, we are finding it very difficult to get relievers when staff are away sick. We have been able to use within

school staff up until now, but the pressure is now on and we will very likely be short-staffed in the near future. If this happens, our only realistic option is to split the class amongst the other classes in the syndicate. This is always a last option and we have been able to avoid it all through Covid, but the winter ills look like they will be worse for us.
