 Discussion: → After analysis of a range of data in Writing (PAT, School tests, Progressions, WTE Assessment, observations and practical tasks) there is a comprehensive list of strengths and areas for development. 								

- → Children's enthusiasm for writing has continued to increase across the specified year levels. This is due in part to teacher enthusiasm and engagement, new techniques and bringing the "fun" back into written language.
- There is also more evidence of students "self-monitoring" their writing for quality and in reflection of the skills being taught.
- The WTE Assessment data is clear in what areas we can focus on and what areas to continue to push (strengths)
- → The Year 4&5 groups for 2020 have shown improvement.

Maori students are progressing in line with other NZ European. Other ethnic cohorts show some differences many of them being ESOL students, however the structure provided with WTE seems to suit the learning styles of many of our ESOL students.

The school continues to provide ESOL programmes to encourage the oral language skills of the students from a range of ethnic groups.

NAG2A (b)(iii) Planned actions for lifting achievement across the school

Points to note:

- PLD focussing on writing across the school will be continued in 2022 as- part of CoL PLD
- WTE and Yolanda Soryl Phonics programmes will be extended by external facilitators, the CoL Across School Teacher and within school teacher
- Development of core criteria for effective writing continued
- Assessment and analysis of writing to compliment the PLD, using WTE and Writing Progressions
- Oral language will continue to be a feature of classroom programmes.
- ESOL programmes support a significant number of students, empowering them in their writing and oral language.

- In 2019 it was identified that Reading levels had dropped. This motivated a more specific approach as part of classroom observations and discussions.
- This has resulted in the levels picking up again in 2020 & 2021.
- There continues to be a move toward more targeted approaches in the senior school, once the students have reached a level of competence.

Discussion:

- Levels have been assessed using the Prime evaluation testing and PAT and an overall judgement made.

- The PAT testing has changed away from the adaptive and is now completed in Sept, so it is based on the child's current year. Testing later in the year, as has been done in the past, assess the child at their next year level.
- 2022 there will be PLD that focuses on aspects of problem-solving; basic facts; application of concepts; Move&Prove (justifying thinking & solutions
