Greetings to you all; tena koutou katoa; Tamanē badhānē śubhēcchā'ō; hilsen til dere alle

We are now at the end of term 2, halfway through 2022. It has been another interesting year to date, with term 1 being heavily impacted by Covid-19 related absences - for both students and staff. We managed to staff the school, thus avoiding having to ask classes to stay home when their teacher was away. We also did not split classes as we tried to maintain some consistency. Term 2 saw a different problem - less Covid absence, but high numbers away with the winter ills and chills. I know that this is not over yet, and encourage people to maintain the high health standards we have used over the past 2 years - handwashing, sanitiser, mask wearing and staying away if you are sick. These are still our best defences as the borders open and people travel more.

Term 3 begins on Monday 25 July. Please remember that we do not have the rooms open until 8.15am and staff are involved in planning and meetings prior to this. Children should not be arriving at school before this time.

You will no doubt have seen the statement put out by Alison Manson, BoT Chair, regarding my decision to retire at the end of 2022. This was not an easy decision, as I have been involved in education for 45 years, with 35 of those being as a principal. In that time, I have worked with some wonderful people, enjoyed the company of amazing students and been welcomed by communities. It feels right for me to retire from teaching/principalship. This has nothing to do with Maunu School - it is a completely personal decision. I have, and still do, enjoy my time here and the people I have had the pleasure to meet and work with. I will continue to work for the betterment of Maunu School for the remainder of the year and wish the board the best of luck with the appointment process.

T3&4 Staffing: We have a number of changes to staffing and organisation coming up. These are unavoidable and we take time and consideration in dealing with any changes needed.

<u>Junior Syndicate</u>: Due to an increase in year
 1 enrolments outside of those we knew

- about, we are having to add another class of Y1 children Rm 7. This will be taught by Mrs Carolyn Scott-Petersen and will be made up of some children from Rm 3&4. The children moving have already been notified.
- Room1: Andi Watts will be shifting into the senior syndicate for the remainder of the year and will no longer do the teacher release in Rm 1 (Friday) or Rm 3 (Wednesday). We have Mrs Lisa Jolly, an experienced, enthusiastic and skilled junior teacher replacing Andi.
- Senior Syndicate: Mrs Katie Bassett-Allen will be taking maternity leave for the remainder of the year, as from the end of term 2. She is expecting her third child in September and we wish them all the very best. Katie has been working in Rm 15 and 16 and her work has been of a high standard. Mrs Andi Watts will join the senior team, teaching in Rm 15 (Thursday & Friday), Rm 16 (Wednesday) and Rm 11 (every second Tuesday). Andi has been in the school for a number of years, has experience in and with the senior syndicate and is known to all the students.

As the Maunu community grows we are having to deal with unexpected enrolments. Each year the school plans for the expected enrolments and predicted enrolments based on present information and historical data. However, these past 2 years have been very difficult to predict as the movement from Auckland had slowed and housing developments have not met their expected timelines. If we get more children enrolling in the junior school, we may have to look at an alternative organisation. While this is not ideal, it is better than having large numbers in the current classrooms. You will be informed if this needs to happen.

3 Way Conferences: Thank you to all those who made it along to the 3 Way Conferences. It is a time to connect with the classroom teacher about your child's progress and learning.



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Visual Arts Celebration: Toward the end of term 3, the school will be holding a celebration of the Visual Arts programme. This will involve an Art "Gallery" being set up in the school for the public to come and view work from every student in the school. The artwork will focus on the work that classes do as part of their visual arts programme. More information and details to come next term.

Matariki Celebration: The school held a great assembly on Thursday 23rd June to celebrate Matariki Day and the work from the week. It was heart-warming to host Maungatapere School and to have their kapa haka roopu perform for us with skill and passion. Maunu School's Te Ahorangi te kura o Maunu also performed - both junior and senior groups and thrilled us with their power and accuracy. The assembly organisers also showed a video demonstrating the activities that happened during the week. We trust you all enjoyed an amazing Matariki Day on 24th June.
