# Greetings to you all; tena koutou katoa; alofagia outou uma; cyfarchion i chi gyd; hilsen til jer alle

Welcome to the final term of 2022. It will be an incredibly busy term for us all. Please keep a check on the notices via the school app, seesaw, and newsletters. We apologize for the number of letters that will come out, but many things will not meet the newsletter timeline and will be important notices and reminders.

We are currently finalising staffing for 2023 and will be able to put this out in the next newsletter.

Children watching violent shows on television and online: It has come to our attention from conversations children have been having in the playground, that there are children who are watching some quite violent and inappropriate (for primary aged children) content on television and online. The discussions are quite graphic and worrying that children this young find the content acceptable. Please talk to your child about what is appropriate to watch and what isn't. There is advice on sites such as NetSafe to support parents in what to do.

**Reports:** End of year Reports will go home on Wednesday 14th December. If your child has joined Maunu School after 1 September they will not receive a written report as there is not enough time to gather valid data for a summative report.

**2023 Meet the Teacher:** On Wednesday 14 December children will also meet their classmates and teacher for 2023.

**2022 Classes:** We are presently looking at class structures for 2023. As we have done for the last 5 years, we ask that you talk to your child's current teacher about their preferred learning style and anything else you think might impact on their learning. We do not take "requests" for placement for a specific teacher. All staff are very capable and of a high quality and we expect to have new staff and some changes in a number of classes in each syndicate.

**Country Fair:** Cara, Nigel and Team have put in an extraordinary effort to create and implement an amazing 2022 Country fair. After a break of 2 years due to Covid 19 regulations, we are really keen to
