Mihi Whakatau - Meet the Team

It was great to begin our first day with a Mihi Whakatau followed by a hui to introduce our Team. A Mihi Whakatau is a formal welcome and is used to welcome guests (Manuhiri) at events which take place away from a marae, often followed by a meeting. Thank you to all our existing whanau (Tangata Whenua) who were able to be at school to welcome our new students, staff and whanau. Our Mihi Whakatau was followed by introductions and welcomes from our BoT Chairperson, Alison Manson, our PTA chairperson Cara Dawson and our staff.

After a shared afternoon tea, teachers opened up the classrooms and invited whanau to informally see the learning spaces and learn about the programmes.

Five Feather Recognition

At Maunu School we reward behaviours that we want to encourage by giving children Values Cards. Values cards are given out in the classrooms and across the school. Values cards are posted into their 'house' box. Each values card gains a house point for their house. Once a fortnight one student from each house is drawn out at assembly, and they receive the **'House Values Cup.'**

We also recognise students demonstrating the values through the blue 'Five Feather Certificates.' These are recognised each week at the syndicate and whole school assemblies.

Our staff and students can regularly be heard chanting **Tahi, Rua, Toru, Whā...pīwakawaka.** This chant refers back to our Five Feather Values, as if they are displaying all Five Feathers they are like our logo, the proud pīwakawaka, adorned with their feathers.

After their six years at Maunu School, our students will leave us as *confident, connected and capable* students ready to soar in whichever pathway they choose.

ABSENCES

If your child is going to be away or late, please either ring the school office on **4388060** and leave a message, or use the Maunu school app (skoolloop) to notify us of an absence.

This is a safety issue, helping us to ensure all our children are safe and are where they should be. If leaving a message, please record your child's full name, room number and **reason they will be absent.**

LATE ARRIVALS

If your child is late to class please ensure that they quickly visit the school office before they go to class to let us know that they are now at school. By telling us as soon as possible it stops us from ringing you enquiring about their whereabouts.



EARLY ARRIVALS

Please do not send children to school before 8.15am as we do not provide supervision for them. Staff often have meetings or are preparing for the day and are all over the school.

It is reasonable for children to begin arriving at school from 8.20am, when staff are in the school.

SUNHATS

Please ensure that your child has a Maunu School sunhat to wear at school. These are compulsory during terms 1 and 4.

We use Lunchonline - <u>www.lunchonline.co.nz</u> where parents and caregivers can order lunches (menus online) for their children on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

Wednesday lunches are supplied by Better Bites and will be delivered in time for lunch at 1.30pm. <u>Thursday Sushi</u> will be delivered for the first eating break at 11.10am, so children can either have this for morning tea or save it for their lunch.

ERO

The Education Review Office (ERO) has shifted to a more developmental approach to evaluation that supports each school's improvement over time.

Key features of the new approach, Te Ara Huarau, are that ERO will:

 \rightarrow work with all schools in an ongoing way rather than as a one-off event

 \rightarrow connect with each school's strategic planning and reporting cycle as part of their improvement journey

→ work in partnership with schools, collaborating in support of equitable and excellent outcomes for all learners

As a result, each school will:

 \rightarrow have a dedicated ERO Evaluation Partner who works alongside the school

 \rightarrow have a different experience depending on needs, strengths, and their school's specific evaluation focus

 \rightarrow be on a three-year evaluation cycle

Our ERO Evaluation Partner is Michelle McCarty, we look forward to formally welcoming Michelle on 1st March. Michelle will be working alongside the school all year.

WE ARE A NUT FREE SCHOOL

Just a reminder to you and to retain your help in maintaining our school as a safe place for all students. Several of our students have potentially severe allergies, with some particularly allergic to nuts. This is in fact a common problem to varying degrees in the community but, in this case, exposure to nuts in any way could be possibly life threatening. In order to address the issue, we ask that you refrain

from giving your child any nuts or products containing nuts (e.g. peanut butter and some mueslitype bars) in their lunch boxes.

All foodstuffs have their ingredients identified on the packaging and we ask that you consider these carefully. *Thank you for your ongoing support.*

SWIMMING

Students will be swimming 3 or 4 times a week for the first 6 weeks. Swimming is part of our P.E and Health Programme, an essential part of our curriculum. We are trying to prepare our students with water confidence and skills. If your child is not swimming for health reasons please contact their teacher via an email or a note.

DIGITAL SAFETY

Digital Treaty

Each year the teachers at Maunu School create a Digital Treaty with their students. They talk about ways with their students to be **S.M.A.R.T** online. The treaty addresses:

- Safety teachers unpack at the child's level ways to keep safe online.
- Meeting people online teachers talk about the importance of never talking to people they do not know online and not sharing personal information.
- Accepting Requests teachers encourage children not to click on pop ups, not to open



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unknown emails and never accepting requests for friendships without checking with a parent first.

- Reliability online teachers talk to children about reliability of what they read online. The importance of checking information and the source. They also talk about being responsible and reliable as a Digital Citizen.
- **Tell** teachers give their students the tools to know what to do if they feel uncomfortable about anything they encounter online. They show them how to Block, Mute and Report a user if they are not following the rules. Above all they explain to students they will not get in trouble if they ask an adult for help.

The main message at Maunu School is **you are the same person online as you are in real life**. We therefore encourage our students to apply their **Five Feather Values** when they are online.

Online Safety at Home

It is useful to revisit the rules and procedures you have in place at home regularly to help keep your child safe online. During the year we will post support material in the newsletter, however if you ever want further support or resources please do not hesitate to get in touch. Here is a simple video to remind you of some simple <u>online safety tips</u>.

BYOD Devices, Phones & Smart Watches

We encourage students to **Bring Your Own Device** here at Maunu School to support their learning. We are happy to help set the students up on our WIFI and the teachers have procedures in place to store student devices safely when the students are not using their device. We understand with busier lives that some parents allow their child to bring a phone or smartwatch to school. Phones **MUST** be handed in to the teacher for safe keeping. If a child needs to check their phone for messages they can do this just before the bell and then phones and devices are placed back into bags to go home. The rule at Maunu School is that devices, phones & smartwatches are not used without supervision. They are not to be used before school, during break times or after school.
