Listening to stories broadens children's experiences.

Please use the opportunity over the term break to continue these narratives. A holiday activity could be to start a special collection or scrap book where family traditions, family recipes and whanau whakapapa can be written down to keep these special stories alive.

Greats, Grands and Whanau Day is one day in our diary, very dear to our hearts. It is our hope that whanau continue to feel that sense of belonging at Maunu School and as the year continues we extend an open invitation to come and share your stories and expertise with our tamariki.

I wish you all a safe and relaxing term break. It has been a busy first term, where we have achieved so much.

I thank our wonderful team of teachers, support staff, PTA, Board of Trustees and whanau for the partnership we have in making this term such a great start to the year for our children.
