The mobile phone recycling scheme has raised over \$3 million for NZ charities thanks



to the support of businesses, government departments, organisations and many thousands of individuals from all over NZ. Phones received are graded, data wiped and sim/memory cards removed and destroyed. Phones that can still be used are sold by tender to off-shore businesses that specialise in the resale of second hand phones. Phones that have reached the end of their life are broken down and recycled in an environmentally friendly way with up to 95% of their materials being recycled into other products.
