Storylines Tour - Michel Mulipola

Maunu school had the opportunity to host Michel Mulipola as part of the Storylines National Story Tours on Tuesday 30th May. Michel Mulipola is an Auckland-based self-taught comic book artist and illustrator who has achieved great success in his field.

During his visit to the Senior Syndicate, Michel Mulipola shared his passion for comic books and discussed how his love for them began at the age of five. He inspired the students with his journey and how it led him to pursue a career in drawing comic books. Michel Mulipola has worked on various projects, including illustrating comics for the WWE and Marvel Comics trading cards. Currently, he is involved in the creation of the US comic book called "Headlocked: The Last Territory." The Storylines National Story Tours are made possible through the support of Creative New Zealand and other funders, including Foundation North. These tours aim to bring leading authors and illustrators to schools, early childhood education centres, community group and libraries, providing valuable experiences and insights to the participants. The best part is that these tours are provided free of charge, thanks to the generous funding from these organizations.
