WHĀNAU

PROMOTING HEALTHY FOOD AND DRINKS

A healthy food and drink environment help support a young person's Wellbeing & Hauora, including their immediate physical and mental growth and development. It also helps establish positive behaviours for the future. Good nutrition can positively affect student behaviour, learning, concentration, and energy. Please only send your child with water to school. We encourage students to have a drink bottle on their desks and to regularly fill this during the day. When students take part in physical activity we emphasise the importance of drinking water for hydration and to refuel with healthy snacks.

We run a free breakfast club every day in the Hall from 8.20am. A healthy start to the day is important for our children.

Students are required to sit and eat their morning tea and lunch for ten minutes to eat as part of Feed & Read. As we sit closely eating together it is important to remind you several of our students have potentially severe allergies, with some particularly allergic to nuts.

This is in fact a common problem to varying degrees in the community but, in this case, exposure to nuts in any way could be possibly life threatening.

In order to address the issue, we ask that you refrain from giving your child any nuts or products containing nuts (e.g. peanut butter and some muesli-type bars) in their lunch boxes.

All foodstuffs have their ingredients identified on the packaging and we ask that you consider these carefully.

MEASLES CASE IN NORTHLAND: AWARENESS FOR FAMILIES AND CAREGIVERS

As you may have read in the media, someone from Northland has recently been diagnosed with measles. The local public health service is in the process of tracing any exposed contacts from this case within Northland.

Measles is infectious, so if you or your whānau develop any of these symptoms, please phone your doctor or after-hours clinic before attending. You can also ring Healthline on 0800 611 116 for advice anytime.

Measles key signs and symptoms

 The illness often begins with fever, cough, runny nose and conjunctivitis (pink, watery and sore eyes), which can last for 2-4 days.

• A red and spotty rash then appears 2-4 days after the first symptoms, beginning at the hairline and gradually spreading down the body to the arms and legs. The rash lasts for up to one week.

MMR vaccination provides excellent protection against measles, which can be a serious illness. Please contact your local GP and find out if you're up to date with your vaccinations.

SYNDICATE POTATO GROWING COMPETITION






