Structured Literacy Approach

Next year, Maunu School is proud to announce the adoption of a Structured Literacy approach in our teaching of the English Curriculum.

Teacher Training

To ensure the successful implementation of the Structured Literacy approach, our teaching staff will undergo specialised training. Teachers in Year 1 - 3 will all be trained using the Better Start Literacy Approach, while those in Year 4 - 6 will undergo training on the iDeal Online Platform. A teacher training day has been scheduled for Monday, 19th February, and has received approval from the Board of Trustees.

Ongoing Professional Learning

Professional development is a continuous process at Maunu School. Throughout the year, our teachers will engage in ongoing professional learning, assessments, reporting systems, and the integration of multi-sensory resources. These initiatives are designed to enhance and enrich our teaching methods, ensuring that our students receive the best possible education.

Health & Safety Review

As part of our ongoing commitment to the safety and well-being of our students, we would like to reinforce the importance of adhering to our Health & Safety guidelines. Your cooperation in communicating these rules to your children is crucial in maintaining a secure environment for everyone.

School Access Hours:

Students should NOT be on site before 8.15 am in the morning. Teachers are required to be on site between 8.15 am and 3.45 pm.

After School Procedures:

Teachers are duty at the main gates and car park directly after school. After the bus bell rings at 3.10 pm, all students are to proceed to the Office Area and sit at the main entrance. This ensures



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that no students are waiting in isolated spaces without the presence of duty teachers.

Late Pick-Up Protocol:

We understand that unforeseen circumstances may lead to late pick-ups. In such cases, please call the Office to relay a message to your child. If your child is still in the Office area after 3.30 pm, they will be booked into After School Care, and charges will apply. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to these guidelines. Our primary goal is to create a safe and secure environment for all students.
