#### WINTER ILLNESSES IMPACTING OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Regular school attendance is so important for learning, friendships, and routine — and we always encourage our tamariki to be here as much as possible. However, as winter illnesses continue to spread throughout the community, we are also mindful of keeping everyone well.

Like many schools, we are currently experiencing a high number of absences due to illness, among both students and staff. This includes our relievers, which makes day-to-day operations more challenging than usual.

We are actively encouraging healthy habits across the kura, such as regular hand sanitising, sneezing into elbows, ventilating classrooms, and supporting the use of masks for those who are immune compromised. Despite our efforts, a small number of students have required hospital care, and some staff have needed extended time to recover.

If your child is unwell, we kindly ask that they stay home to rest and recover fully before returning to school. This supports not only their own health but helps to protect others as well.

#### **OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS**

The Maunu School Board of Trustees invites applications for students living out of zone to enrol at Maunu School.

The school's enrolment scheme details are available from the school's office along with application forms.

The Board of Trustees have determined that we have places available for out of zone students in the following year levels:

Year 1 students who will be 5 before the 1st of June 2026. We have up to 15 places available.

Year 3 students 2026. We have 4 spaces available.

Year 4 students 2026. We have 10 spaces available.

The deadline for receipt of applications is Wednesday October 8, 2025.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on Wednesday, October 15 2025. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within 3 school days of the ballot being held.


#### LEARNING ABOUT NEW ZEALAND CURRICULUM REFRESH

#### New Zealand Curriculum Refresh: Understand, Know, Do (UKD)

As part of the nationwide refresh of the New Zealand Curriculum, schools across Aotearoa are beginning to explore a new way of designing teaching and learning. This refreshed curriculum is built around the **UKD model – Understand, Know, Do** – and is designed to support deep learning and strong progress for all students.

#### So, what is **UKD**?

- **Understand**: These are the *big ideas* and concepts we want students to make sense of. They help learners make connections across subjects and develop deeper thinking.
- **Know**: This is the content knowledge facts, vocabulary, information and context students need to support their learning.
- **Do**: These are the *skills, capabilities, and actions* students use to apply what they know and understand in meaningful ways.



The **Understand–Know–Do model weaves through all areas of the curriculum**, helping teachers design learning that is purposeful, culturally responsive, and builds on students' strengths.

At Maunu School, we are beginning to embed this model in our planning and classroom practice. It supports our commitment to nurturing curious, capable learners who are confident and connected to their world.

We'll continue to keep you updated as this refresh unfolds and share ways we're bringing the new curriculum to life at school.




Voting papers will be issued no later than Wednesday 13 August. The voting packs will contain all the details on how to vote in the election as well as candidate statements and photos.

#### **PLANTING DAY REPORT JULY 2025**

There was excitement in the air as the students, parents, and teachers from Maunu School and the epic GJ Gardner Whangarei volunteers arrived back to Andrew's farm in Mata. I overheard one student exclaim "Is this a dream?" as he hoped out of the car and looked around the farm.

Sharon and the students had done an amazing job growing and caring for the native plants since spring. Some of the plants had already been trimmed down twice as they were growing so well! After a quick safety briefing, we made our way to the planting site. The students were given a planting demonstration and learnt about the pūkeko test (this is where students tug on the plant to see if it can survive a pūkeko trying to pull it out). We were also lucky enough to have Andrew tell us more about how our planting will enhance biodeiversity as well as all the benefits of improving the water quality in the stream.

Everyone worked hard with the motivation coming from Andrews BBQ and the promise of being taken to see the new calves.

Together we planted 610 new native trees and grasses! Thank you to everyone involved for helping to make such a fun and successful planting day – TFS Facilitator, Kate Davies


