OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

The Maunu School Board of Trustees invites applications for students living out of zone to enrol at Maunu School. The school's enrolment scheme details are available from the school's office along with application forms.

The Board of Trustees have determined that we have places available for out of zone students in the following year levels:

Year 1 students who will be 5 before the 1st of June 2026. We have up to 15 places available.

Year 3 students 2026. We have 4 spaces available.

Year 4 students 2026. We have 10 spaces available.

The deadline for receipt of applications is Wednesday October 8, 2025.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on Wednesday, October 15 2025. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within 3 school days of the ballot being held.

NZ CURRICULUM REFRESH AND PARENT PORTAL Q&A

The Ministry of Education is refreshing the New Zealand Curriculum to ensure every child receives a clear, consistent, and well-structured learning journey. A key change is the move from a **levels-based curriculum** to one built around **scope and sequence**.

What's the difference?

- Old approach (Levels): Learning was organised into broad "levels" (e.g., Level 2, Level 3).
 Teachers had flexibility to choose content, but this sometimes meant students in different classrooms could be learning quite different things, and key knowledge was not always covered in sequence.
- **New approach (Scope and Sequence):** Learning is clearly set out in phases (Years 1–3, 4–6, 7–8). Each phase outlines the **scope** (what content is taught) and the **sequence** (the order in which it is taught). This ensures all children are taught the same essential knowledge, concepts, and skills in a carefully planned order.

Why is scope and sequence important?

- **Consistency:** Every child across Aotearoa will be exposed to the same important content—no one misses out.
- **Clarity:** Parents, teachers, and students know what comes next, creating a smoother learning pathway.
- Progression: Skills and knowledge build logically over time, making learning stronger and more connected.
- **Equity:** All children, no matter where they go to school, are guaranteed access to the same core learning.

The refreshed curriculum is being introduced gradually, starting with **English** and **Mathematics & Statistics** in 2025. Other subjects will follow. We are excited about this change, as it provides a clearer roadmap for learning and ensures our tamariki are well supported to grow their knowledge and skills step by step.


