LEARNING ABOUT NZ CURRICULUM REFRESH

1 Hour A Day!

Here at Maunu School, we are so excited to continue building a love for learning in your child, and a big part of that is celebrating the basics! You may have heard about the Ministry of Education's new "one hour a day" policy for teaching core skills, and we wanted to share what that looks like in our school.

We dedicate one hour each day to literacy and numeracy, but what's truly wonderful is how we weave these skills into everything else we do. It's not just a standalone lesson; it's a way of thinking that helps students connect their learning across all subjects. At Maunu School, we teach using the Science of Learning Pedagogy, ensuring that our teaching methods are grounded in how the brain learns best.

Our Structured Approach to Literacy and Numeracy

In Maths, we use a Structured Approach supported by PR1ME Maths. This framework ensures our students are taught with the required learning progressions for their year level. We go beyond just numbers, using Rich Tasks to encourage our students to engage in "maths talk," justify their reasoning, and develop strong problem-solving skills.

For literacy, we also follow a structured approach. We teach Better Start Literacy Approaches (BSLA) in the Junior Syndicate and iDeaL Structured Literacy in the Senior Syndicate. Alongside these, we engage our writers using Writer's Toolbox, which provides a consistent framework and set of tools for developing and expanding their ideas.

The Power of Integration

By integrating these essential skills throughout the day, we're helping your child build a strong, reliable foundation for all their learning.

- Reading stories isn't just about sounding out words; it helps your child understand new topics in science and social studies.
- Writing isn't only for creative stories; it's how students express their amazing ideas in art and technology.
- And maths isn't just about numbers; it's about the problem-solving skills they need for design projects and science experiments.

Our teachers use a variety of fun, engaging strategies like games, investigations, and collaborative projects to make sure these lessons are lively, purposeful, and connected to your child's world.

Our tamariki are in great hands, as our teachers have undertaken extensive Professional Learning and Development and are always striving to follow up-to-date best practices.

Our **Move A Thon** is happening in **Term 4**, **Week 3**, **on Thursday October 23rd**. We're calling on all students to get active, stay fit, and help us raise funds for our school!

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

The Maunu School Board of Trustees invites applications for students living out of zone to enrol at Maunu School. The school's enrolment scheme details are available from the school's office along with application forms.

The Board of Trustees have determined that we have places available for out of zone students in the following year levels:

Year 1 students who will be 5 before the 1st of June 2026. We have up to 15 places available.

Year 3 students 2026. We have 4 spaces available.

Year 4 students 2026. We have 10 spaces available.

The deadline for receipt of applications is Wednesday October 8, 2025.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on Wednesday, October 15 2025. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within 3 school days of the ballot being held.
