

Strike Action

We were notified on Tuesday that our NZEI Te Riu Roa Union members will be taking strike action on **Thursday 23 October**. Our teachers are passionate about our students and their learning. They are committed to providing the best possible education and want to ensure they have the resources and support they need to help every student reach their full potential. We understand this may cause inconvenience for your family and we appreciate your support and understanding. We will continue to keep you informed of any further updates.

Safe Drop Off & Pick Ups

The safety of our tamariki and wider school community is our highest priority. When dropping off or picking up your children, we ask that you take extra time and care. We know the design of the pull-in bays is not ideal and it can be difficult to back out into traffic. However, we have had far too many reported near misses where vehicles have reversed into oncoming cars or created unsafe situations.

Please always check carefully before backing out, move slowly, and remain aware that children can be unpredictable when exiting vehicles or crossing between cars. It only takes a moment of inattention for an accident to occur.

We want every child to arrive and leave school safely, but just as importantly, we want our whole community and whānau to feel safe and confident during drop-off and pick-up times. By working together, showing patience and putting safety first, we can create a calm and secure zone for everyone.

TE WIKI O TE REO MAORI

This week our kura has been celebrating Te Wiki o te Reo Māori, a special time where we join the rest of Aotearoa in recognising and uplifting Te Reo Māori. As a nation, we are encouraged to grow our confidence, strengthen our voices and keep Te Reo alive in our everyday lives.

This year, we celebrate the 50th Anniversary of Te Wiki o te Reo Māori. It began as a single Māori Language Day in 1972, grew to a week in 1974 and by 1975 it was firmly established.

This year's theme is ake, ake – a forever language. At school, tamariki have enjoyed a colouring-in competition and taken part in daily Te Reo Challenges designed to spark conversation, build vocabulary and normalise the use of Te Reo Māori in fun and meaningful ways. It has been wonderful to see students and staff embracing these challenges and encouraging each other to give new words and phrases a go.

ART EXHIBITION – CELEBRATING NORTHLAND

On Thursday we closed the doors on our Art Exhibition and what an incredible journey it has been. This exhibition was so much more than a gallery of student artwork. Adorn the bird with feathers so it may fly. Our team adorned our tamariki with the feathers of creativity, confidence, and pride and because of that, they soar.


















WPSSA CROSS COUNTRY

On August the 27th, Mrs Dawson took close to 50 students to Barge Park to represent Maunu School at the WPSSA cross Country Champs. Despite the rain and the mud all our students performed amazingly well and did our school very proud. Most races had upwards of 150 students in them and some more than 200 students per race. The majority of our students placed in the top half of the field and we had a number of top 50 finishes.

Four of our students reached the top ten in their races and received awards from WPSSA for their efforts as follows.

10 year old boys - 6th place - Nixon Hood, 9 year old boys - 2nd place - William Hardwick, 7th Place - Charlie Green and 9 year old Girls - 7th place - Holly Harrison. A huge congratulations to these talented students. We are very proud of you all for displaying your five feather values on the day and coping with all the mud!







LEARNING ABOUT NZ CURRICULUM REFRESH

NZ Curriculum Refresh – Focus on Maths

During our Teacher Only Day on **Monday 15th September**, our teaching team focused on the *Structured Approach to Maths* as part of the refreshed New Zealand Curriculum. One key area we explored in depth was the importance of **Maths Talk** in the classroom.

Maths Talk is about far more than simply answering a question – it encourages children to explain their thinking, listen to others, challenge ideas respectfully and refine their understanding. It is a vital part of helping tamariki become confident and articulate mathematical thinkers.

We unpacked the **Maths Talk Poster**, a resource designed to enhance mathematical and statistical communication. This poster provides prompts that help improve the quality of classroom conversations.

Some examples of these discussion starters include:

- Explain and Justify: "I think ... because ..."
- Say More: "Tell me more about ..." / "How or why did you ...?"
- Different Viewpoints: "I (dis)agree with ... because ..."
- Revoice or Repeat: "Are you saying that ...?"
- Reflect and Revise: "I changed my mind because ..." / "A different way is ..."
- Add On: "To build on that ..." / "To support that ..."

These prompts act as scaffolds for all students, helping them to actively listen, think critically and engage meaningfully with mathematical ideas and with one another.

The Investigation Cycle in Maths

We also explored how **the investigation cycle** fits across all types of mathematics lessons. Investigations may involve:

- Short tasks such as a problem-solving activity that introduces and motivates a new concept.
- **Rich tasks within a lesson** encouraging students to apply concepts, procedures, and processes in new situations.
- Extended tasks complex problems that span several lessons or weeks, allowing students to dig deeper.

Examples of rich tasks might include:

- **Real-world contexts**: e.g., designing a container to hold popcorn.
- Mathematical explorations: e.g., investigating the properties of magic triangles.

These types of tasks help students connect with what they already know while building their understanding of new mathematical concepts.

Supporting Positive Relationships with Maths

At Maunu School, we want all tamariki to feel confident and positive about maths. To support this, our teachers are making sure tasks are:

- Low floor, high ceiling accessible to all learners, but with the potential to extend thinking.
- **Supportive of persistence** with prompts and scaffolds that encourage students to keep trying.
- **Success-focused** giving every child opportunities to experience achievement.

Through the refreshed curriculum, our goal is to ensure that all learners see themselves as capable mathematicians – able to explore, explain, and engage with maths in ways that are meaningful and enjoyable.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS

The Maunu School Board of Trustees invites applications for students living out of zone to enrol at Maunu School. The school's enrolment scheme details are available from the school's office along with application forms.

The Board of Trustees have determined that we have places available for out of zone students in the following year levels:

Year 1 students who will be 5 before the 1st of June 2026. We have up to 15 places available.

Year 3 students 2026. We have 4 spaces available.

Year 4 students 2026. We have 10 spaces available.

The deadline for receipt of applications is Wednesday October 8, 2025.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on Wednesday, October 15 2025. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within 3 school days of the ballot being held.
